The College of Education's Curriculum Committee has had a successful and busy academic year. Dr. Sally Zepeda led the committee in the new online voting system.

The curriculum committee passed 24 new courses of which 14 or 58% were at the graduate level. There were 175 course changes, 26 course deletions (these were all from Kinesiology), 1 proposal for a new program in TESOL (LLE), and 1 proposal for an Area of Emphasis in Human Resource and Organizational Development (LEAP). There were 6 program name changes in the areas of Counseling & Student Personnel Services, Guidance & Counseling, Occupational Studies, and Reading Education and 2 terminations of programs (Kinesiology). There were 3 program change proposals in Career & Technical Education, English Education, & Reading Education. There was 1 proposal for an External Degree for Special Education at the Griffin Campus. There were 2 proposals for new course pre-fixes in the departments of Kinesiology and Workforce Education, Leadership & Social Foundations.

Kinesiology and Workforce Education, Leadership, & Social Foundations requested new course pre-fixes. Of the 175 course changes, 149 came from Kinesiology due to the new course pre-fix change.

Within the 24 new courses proposed, the preponderance were from the following departments: Lifelong Education, Administration & Policy (10), Elementary and Social Studies Education (1), Counseling & Human Development (4), Communication Sciences and Special Education (2), and Kinesiology (3), Educational Psychology and Instructional Technology (1), Mathematics and Science (1).

There are 17 courses yet to be acted on by the University Curriculum System, 8 at the University Curriculum staff review level, and 9 at the Executive Council level. The chart on the following page summarizes the majority of the curriculum committee's activity to date.
